TRAINING

Reserve Unit members enter a field training period with the Crystal Police Department.

Reserve unit members must attend the Hennepin County Reserve School. This is a 30-hour course that usually occurs in the fall. The training helps prepare reserve officers with work in their community.

Additional training includes:

- CPR/Basic First Aid.
- Use of handcuffs, pepper spray and baton.
- Traffic direction.
- Water and ice rescue.
- Medical and field training scenarios.

Reserve Officers are also required to attend one monthly meeting, generally held on Sunday evenings at the Crystal Police Department.
